## NOMINATION & APPLICATION PROCESS

### UNIVERSITY NOMINATION DEADLINES

FULL YEAR (FY) or FALL semester (S1):

15th April 2023

SPRING semester (S2):

15th October 2023



### STUDENT APPLICATION DEADLINES

FULL YEAR (FY) or FALL semester (S1):

1st May 2023

SPRING (S2) semester:

1st November 2023

### APPLICATION PROCESS

#### Step 1 NOMINATION

Exchange students are nominated through the International Office of their home university. Once their nomination has been confirmed by AMU, online application has to be submitted.

#### Step 2 ONLINE APPLICATION

Complete the online application through AMU's mobility portal. The documents listed on the next page have to be submitted.

#### Step 3 ADMISSION

After the application has been examined and accepted, students will receive an admission letter as well as "the welcome package" with all useful informations.

- ✓ **Learning agreement** (*preselected courses at AMU by nominated students*): a minimum of credits in their main field of studies might be required by some faculties
- ✓ **Copy of passport**
- ✓ **Reference Letter**

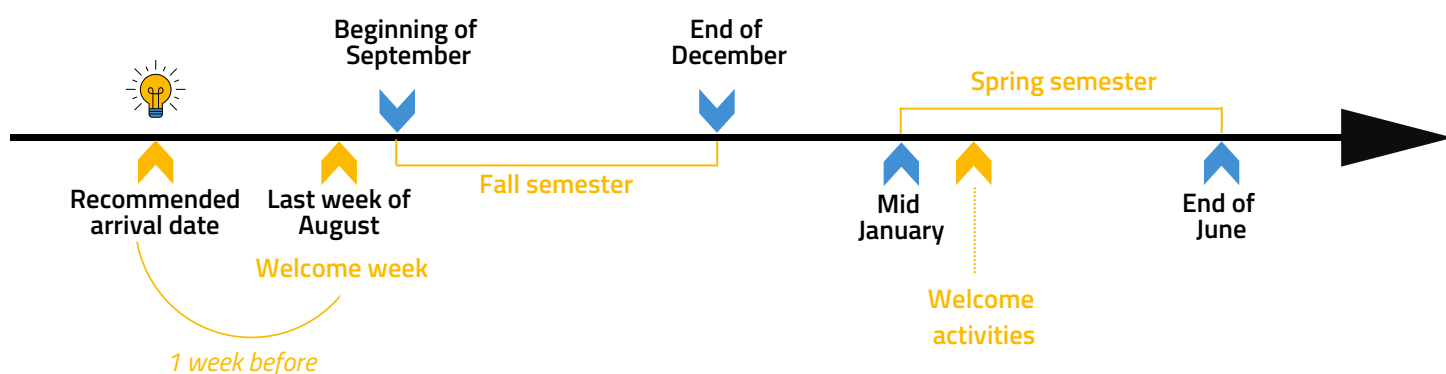

**\*\*Depending on the programme / faculty, there may be no re-sits sessions.**

## REQUIRED LEVEL OF LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

Students may pursue courses in French and/or English. Language level requirement depends on the Faculty:



**Students with at least a B1 level in French** may pursue regular French courses (B2 level is required at the Faculty of Law).

A French Language certificate (*TCF, DELF, DALF*) is highly recommended.



**For some countries, a language certificate is required for immigration purposes.**



**Students with at least B2 level in English** may pursue regular courses taught in English (C1 level in English is required at the Faculty of Arts and Humanities).

Evidence of English proficiency is highly recommended (*TOEFL, TOEIC, IELTS*).

## SUL (UNIVERSITY SERVICE OF LANGUAGES)

### FLE-AMU FRENCH CLASSES OPEN TO EXCHANGE STUDENTS

30 hours of French courses, spread over 10 weeks (one semester) and subject to availability.

In order to qualify for **6 ECTS**, students are required to include **"FLE-AMU" courses in their Learning Agreement** and to follow **9 additional hours of online self learning**.

### FULL-TIME FRENCH COURSES AT SUL

This program, available for one semester or full academic year, is open to international students. It **gives access to the University Diploma in French Language and Culture** (DU de langue et culture française).

**Level?** From complete beginners to experienced users.

**Language test?** Mandatory online placement test is organised before arrival.



Online application for students admitted full-time at our French Language center (SUL) is simplified

**Credits?** 30 ECTS per semester for 18 hours of classes per week and possibility of taking 2 or 3 hours additional workshops.

### ARRIVAL BY PLANE

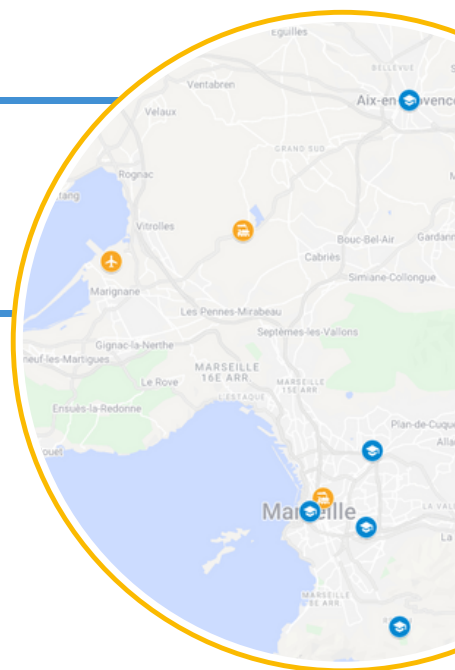
The closest airport to Aix-en-Provence and Marseille is **MARSEILLE-PROVENCE AIRPORT** located approximatively 20 miles away from Aix or Marseille.

### ARRIVAL BY TRAIN

There are two different train stations "gare" associated with **Aix-en-Provence**:

- **the Gare SNCF Aix Centre-Ville** is located in downtown Aix-en-Provence
- **AIX TGV** is the high speed train station located about 15 minutes by bus outside Aix-en-Provence.

Only one train station is associated to Marseille: **Gare SNCF Marseille Saint Charles**

## ON CAMPUS HOUSING



Halls of residence in Aix-en-Provence or in Marseille: single room (10 m<sup>2</sup>) with bed, desk, chair, fridge, washbasin, shower and private toilet. Shared kitchen facilities in each building. To book their room students will be required to:

### >>> Before their arrival

- Fill in the MoveOn and MesServicesEtudiants forms
- Confirm their booking through a 100€ down payment
- Upload their proof of identity and housing insurance including personal liability
- Sign and upload their housing contract

### >>> Upon their arrival

- Pay their room for the whole semester at the frontdesk of the residence
- Pay a security deposit (refunded at check out)



NB. Cash payment is not accepted. Students should confirm with their bank that they can make international payments with their card.
