




WHAT IS 2+2 UNDERGRADUATE PATHWAY?





Degree Pathway in Hawai'i






Our most populous age group is 18-24 years.



Eligibility Requirements for OPT?

- Students MUST have been in lawful F-1 student status for at least 1 full academic year and graduating from a <u>Certificate of Adievement program</u> (1 year) or an <u>Associates Degree</u> (2 year)
- Employment must be directly related to the student's major
