NOMINATION PROCESS

UOW have implemented a new process for student nominations. All nominations must be submitted online. No nominations will be accepted by email.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Students must apply on our online application system. Please note students will be asked to upload the following documentation into their online application:

- An original copy of your academic transcript
- An original copy of your English language results (if applicable)
- A Study Abroad and Exchange Supporting Statement Form completed by their home university

Students wishing to live in <u>University accommodation</u> should also complete a separate housing application before the accommodation application deadline. Students who apply on time are guaranteed a place in University housing.

Students will also be asked to submit their study plan as part of prearrival or orientation communications. Students will receive instructions about how to enrol in classes (online) after their study plans have been assessed. Study Abroad and Exchange students are required to hold a valid <u>visa</u> to study at UOW.
