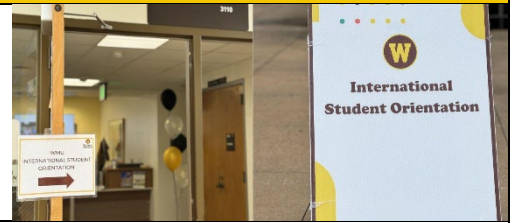

Housing Information

Undergraduate Students

Undergraduate Exchange and American University Experience students are required to live on campus in residence halls. Students should apply online for housing immediately after receiving admission to Western Michigan University.

WMU's residence halls house nearly 5,000 students and offer a vibrant, diverse community with access to leadership opportunities, hall activities, high-speed Internet, 24-hour staff support, nearby dining halls, and other on-campus amenities designed for student success.



Graduate Students

Graduate Exchange and American University Experience students are strongly encouraged to live in university-sponsored (on-campus) housing during their program. While on-campus housing is not mandatory, students who choose to live off campus are solely responsible for securing accommodations, signing rental agreements, and complying with lease terms.


Please note that most **off-campus leases are for a full year (12 months)**, making **short-term arrangements challenging** and **potentially costly** to terminate early.

Course Information	
Courses Available for Exchange and American University Experience Students	 <p>Exchange and American University Experience students may enroll in most WMU courses, provided they meet the necessary prerequisites, demonstrate sufficient English proficiency, and submit all required documents by the stated deadlines. Some courses may require pre-approval from the relevant academic department or college.</p> <p>Please note that flight science courses in the College of Aviation are not open to exchange or American University Experience students. Additionally, many College of Fine Arts courses (Art, Dance, Music, and Theatre) have major restrictions and limited availability. Priority enrollment is given to WMU degree-seeking students, and these classes may not be accessible to exchange participants.</p>
Credits Required for Exchange and American University Experience Students	<p>Undergraduate students must enroll in 12 to 15 credit hours per semester, with 12 credits being the minimum required to maintain visa status.</p> <p>Graduate students typically take 6 to 9 credit hours per semester, with a minimum of 6 credits required to maintain visa status.</p>
Course Registration Procedure	<p>After submitting the online application, students will be contacted about their course selection. WMU advisors will register Exchange and American University Experience students based on their choices, eligibility, and course availability.</p>
Academic Transcripts	<p>Students must request and send their official transcript to their home institution after grades are posted. Due to U.S. privacy laws (FERPA), WMU cannot send transcripts on behalf of students. For more information, please visit: https://wmich.edu/registrar/transcripts.</p>
Grading Scale	<p>Students receive a single grade for each course, reflecting coursework, tests, and final exams. Letter grades carry specific honor points per credit hour. For more information, please visit: http://www.wmich.edu/registrar/policies/grades.</p>

Estimated Program Costs

Exchange Program

2026–27 Estimated Cost per Semester: \$8,500

WMU exchange agreements cover **12–15 credit hours** per semester for **undergraduates** and **6–9 credit hours** per semester for **graduates**. Students taking **additional credits will pay non-resident tuition per credit**.

Standard WMU registration fees apply to all students, including exchange students, depending on the home university agreement. **Additional course-specific fees may apply** at registration and vary by student and course choice. These **fees are not known in advance** and may be the student's responsibility.

Students should consult their home university's international office to confirm which fees are covered under their exchange agreement.

Due to a recent change in U.S. tax law, **scholarships exceeding tuition are subject to a 14% tax. This tax will be charged to exchange students' accounts**, and students are **responsible for payment**. The withheld amount is typically **reimbursed when students file U.S. tax forms**, which will be available on our website in late January. (<http://www.wmich.edu/internationaladmissions>).

Health Insurance Requirements

WMU automatically enrolls all international students in the international student health insurance plan. WMU has contracted with GeoBlue which is a single, comprehensive plan designed to meet student's health care needs, regardless of age or preexisting conditions. The plan also meets the coverage requirements established by the U.S. Department of State for exchange visitors and international students on J-1 or J-2 visas.

J-Visa Holders Insurance Requirements

Students entering the U.S. on a **J visa** must have health insurance that meets the **minimum requirements** set by U.S. Department of State regulations:
