About the Programmes

The focus of long-term English language programmes is the development of English communication skills and cross-cultural awareness. There are opportunities to engage in conversation exchanges with local students and to experience New Zealand culture by living with a local family.

Long-term study in English language is in two programmes:

A: General English (GE) – 12 weeks

B: NZ Certificate in English Language (NZCEL) – 18 weeks

About Ara

Ara Institute of Canterbury is a New Zealand government-owned tertiary education institution that has more than 100 years of teaching experience and is the largest institute of technology in the South Island of New Zealand. About the General English programme

The General English programme is comprised of 20 hours of English language study per week. Students may be placed in a class of international students, or a mixed class of international and domestic students. Class placement is dependent on the student's level and the number of enrolments in that level at the time of the student's enrolment.

The General English programme is open all year round, and students can start any Monday for a minimum enrolment of 4 weeks.

Tuition fees are calculated on a per-week basis.

On completion, students receive an Ara certificate.



About the NZ Certificate in English Language programme

The NZCEL programme is comprised of 20 hours of English language study per week. Students are placed in a mixed class of international and domestic students.

The NZCEL programme has two start dates per year: February and July. Students enrol for the full programme of 20 weeks (18 weeks study with a 2-week study break). Academic English has a third start date, in September.

At higher levels, there are options to study either General English or Academic English.

Tuition fees are calculated on a per-semester basis.

On completion, students who pass all assessments receive an NZQA certificate.



Facilities and Services

Students in both GE and NZCEL have access to all facilities and services provided by Ara including:

- Library
- Computer access: free 24-hour internet and computer lab use
- Language Self-Access Centre: staffed by specialist Learning Facilitators; for independent language study, open before and after class
- Bilingual Japanese and Chinese student support advisors
- Homestay advisor
- Cafés and restaurant on campus
- Health centre
- Recreation centre and gym



Teaching Staff

Teaching staff on the English Language programmes are qualified and experienced English language teachers with a background in teaching international students.

Students study grammar, lexis and pronunciation integrated with the four language skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing. Teaching is both interactive and communicative in style and involves students working in groups, individually and in simulated role plays.

Students are invited to participate in cultural, recreational and sightseeing activities which are available during their stay in Christchurch. These activities vary month to month and include conversation exchanges, cultural clubs and off-site field trips. All activities are optional and students pay any entry fees themselves.

Accommodation

Accommodation is organized by a local company specializing in looking after overseas students. New Zealand homestay providers have a reputation for being friendly, hospitable and generous with their time to students.

All students are asked to complete a detailed application form before departure from their country. From this form, information relating to students and prospective families will be carefully examined to ensure suitable placements.

Accommodation costs can be paid separately to meal costs if required by institutions.

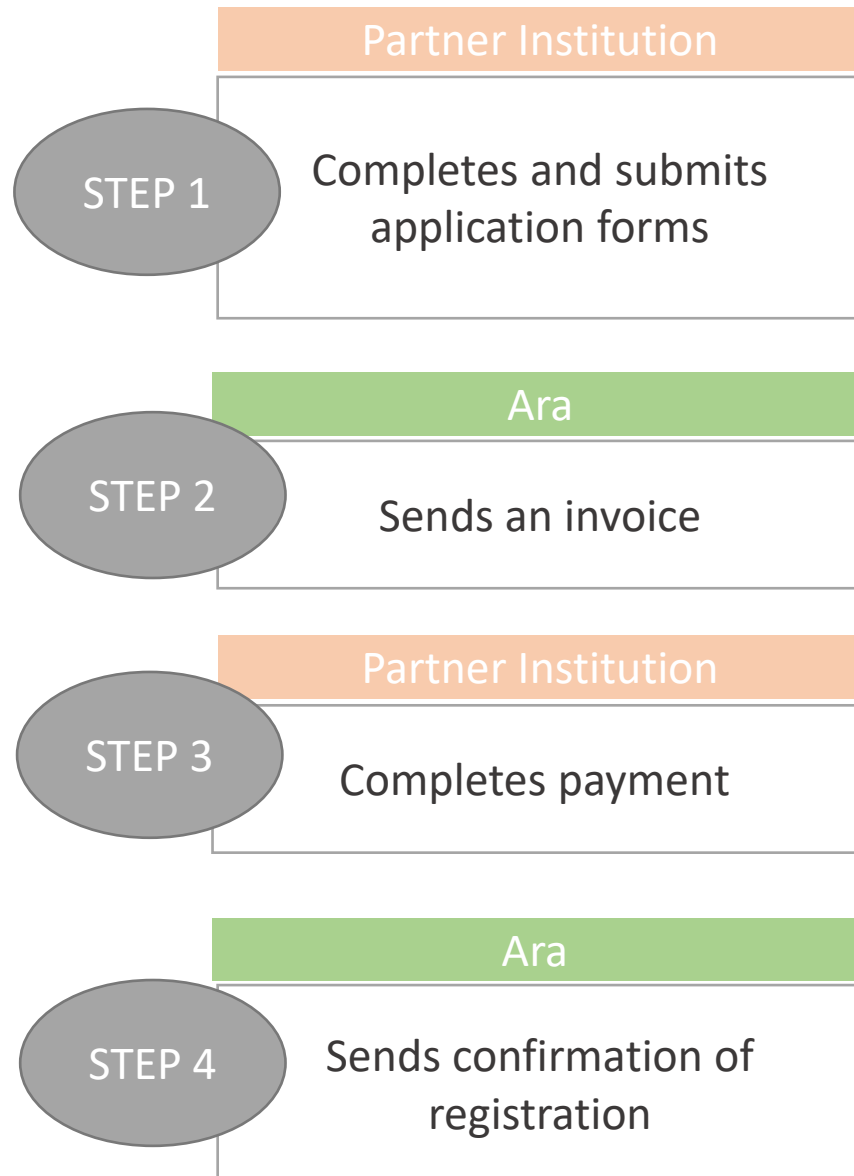

Application Process



Proposals and Agreements, Payment, Postponements, Cancellations, Refunds and Amendments

1. **Proposals and Agreements:**
 - This is a draft proposal for discussion. Ara will send a proposal with a signed agreement to offer the programme, for the institution or agent to sign and return.
2. **Payments**
 - Full payment is required to complete each participant's enrolment in this programme. The payment must be received by Ara **six weeks** prior to the programme starting date.
3. **Cancellations, Refunds and Amendments**

All cancellations must be received in writing. If a cancellation is made, Ara will refund the payments according to our Refund Policy and in the following manner:

 - Participant withdrawing prior to the programme start date: full refund less NZ\$500 administration fee.
 - Participant withdrawing within the first 7 calendar days of study: 80% of tuition fee paid and NZ\$500 administration fee
 - Participant withdrawing after 7 calendar days of study: no refund
 - No refund of the homestay placement fee under any circumstances.
4. All prices are quoted in New Zealand dollars and include local Goods and Services Tax of 15%
5. Ara reserves the right to alter the programme, itinerary or accommodation in the event of unforeseen circumstances (such as extreme weather and road closures) beyond its control. Ara will not be responsible for extra charges incurred due to unforeseen circumstances.
6. The programme requires a minimum number of participants to operate. Ara reserves the right to cancel or reschedule the programme due to insufficient demand, unsafe conditions, events beyond Ara's control, or any other reason.
